



Medicare Reimbursement Restrictions for Physician-Owned Hospitals: PlanPrescriber Offers Advice for Patients

A provision in the Patient Protection Affordable Care Act of 2010 places limits on physician-owned hospitals with immediate restrictions on expansion for existing hospitals. The Act also requires that new doctor-owned facilities be certified by December 31, 2010 in order to participate in Medicare. Currently, there are approximately 265 existing physician-owned hospitals in the United States, and an estimated 29 new physician-owned hospitals are expected to open by the December deadline. As a result, a significant number of Medicare patients could be affected by the new provision. Patients need to know how to protect themselves from increased healthcare costs, make sure they still have appropriate health insurance coverage, and investigate their healthcare provider options.

Tips for Medicare Patients

- Check to see if your hospital is physician-owned: The best way to find out if your hospital is physician-owned is to contact your hospital directly. You can also check online at http://media.washingtonpost.com/wp-srv/nation/documents/Hospitals_Reviewed.pdf for a partial list of physician-owned hospitals in the United States.
- Call ahead: Before you begin making new appointments, it's a good idea to contact your hospital and find out whether this new provision will affect you. Continue to check in with the hospital periodically to make sure to stay abreast of any changes in costs or procedures.
- Protect your wallet: Compare Medicare Advantage and Medicare Supplement insurance providers to make sure that your current hospital is still within your network in 2011 if you're covered by Original Medicare or have a Medicare Advantage HMO plan. - Get a second opinion: Get a second opinion when selecting your primary care doctor or a specialist. Consult trusted sources, check doctor reviews online, and ask friends and family for their recommendations when selecting a hospital, regardless of whether it is physician-owned.
